 - DEFEND CHOICES IN SHORT FORM (UP TO 500 WORDS)
 - COMPOSE A SHORT FORM NON-FICTION, EVEN IF "UNREALISTIC", 1000-5K WORDS
 - COMPOSE A LONG FORM NON-FICTION, EVEN IF "UNREALISTIC", 5K-10K WORDS
 - COMPOSE A SHORT FORM FICTION, 1000-5000 WORDS OR 10 ILLUSTRATED PAGES
 - COMPOSE A LONG-FORM FICTION, 5000-10K WORDS OR 20 ILLUSTRATED PAGES
- **THE NEWSPAPER PROJECT**
 - DESIGN, DEVELOP AND PUBLISH A "MODERN STYLE" NEWSPAPER PERIODICAL FOR PEOPLE OF HISTORIC ERA AND CULTURE, INCLUDING IMAGERY/ILLUSTRATIONS
 - SELECT AND SUBMIT COMPLETED COMPOSITIONS AT A QUALITY THAT CAN BE USED AS REFERENCE FOR FUTURE STUDENTS RESOURCING FROM ARCHIVES

- EXPAND WRITER'S PORTFOLIO UTILIZING PUBLICATION PROCESS
 - COMPOSE TWO SHORT FORM PIECES 1000-5K WORDS OR 10 ILLUSTRATED PAGES
 - ONE FICTION OR POETRY COLLECTION
 - ONE NON FICTION EXPOSITORY OR JOURNALISTIC
 - COMPOSE ONE LONG FORM PIECE OVER 50K WORDS OR 50 ILLUSTRATED PAGES
- ENSURE WORKS ARE AT BEST QUALITY AND PUBLISH COMPOSITIONS TO ARCHIVE FOR FUTURE STUDENTS. INCLUDE SHORT DESCRIPTIONS OF PIECES
